### THE COUNTER TERRORISM BILL 2024



#### A THREAT TO SIERRA LEONE'S DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS?



In a Press Release on 16th January 2025, the Parliament of Sierra Leone announced that they have debated and committed the Bill entitled; "The Counter Terrorism Act, 2024", to the Legislative committee for further consideration.

According to the that Press Release, the Bill seeks to provide for the establishment of the National Counter-Terrorism Coordination Committee, to provide for offenses of terrorism and terrorism-related matters, to provide for enforcement measures on terrorist funds and other assets, to provide for the prohibition of financial support to terrorism, and to provide for other related matters.

Presenting the Bill before the

House, the Attorney-General and Minister of Justice Alpha Sesay noted that the Bill before the House is divided into eleven parts that seek to address issues relating to terrorism.

The Parliamentary Chairman of Defence Hon. Alex M. Rogers in his submission, said, "the Bill is vital for the development of the State and urged for a parliamentary security collaboration songs with the State." He pleaded with colleague MPs to speedily pass the Bill into law.

This Counter Terrorism Bill, 2024 has sparked significant concern among Sierra Leoneans, with many questioning its potential impact on fundamental freedoms. Dr. Richard Konteh is one of the leading advocates calling for all citizens, political leaders, civil society organizations, and the international community to stand together in opposing this Counter Terrorism Bill 2024.

In a detailed tweet on his X (Tweeter) handle @DUnifier Dr. Richard Konteh (The Unifier), and on an Open Letter to Hon. Abdul Kargbo, Leader of the APC Parliamentary Caucus, Dr. Konteh strongly condemned the Counter Terrorism Bill 2024, stating it contains provisions that go beyond its intended purpose and strike at the very heart of Sierra Leone's democratic foundations. The proposed Bill, in it's current form represents a grave and dangerous assault on our fundamental civil liberties, including the right to free speech, freedom of the press, freedom of conscience, and the right to peaceful assembly. We believe it is both unconstitutional and counterproductive to national unity and peace.

Dr. Konteh said, "while we all support efforts to protect national security and safeguard the lives of Sierra Leoneans, there is a delicate balance that must be struck between security measures and the protection of our basic rights."

In his recent open letter to Hon. Abdul Kargbo, Leader of the APC Parliamentary Caucus, titled "Urgent Call to Reject the Counter-Terrorism Bill 2024 in the Current Context." Dr. Konteh raised several concerns regarding certain clauses in the Bill that could infringe on constitutional rights, particularly the freedoms every Sierra Leonean hold dear—such as the right to protest, the freedom to organize, and the ability to express dissent. These freedoms are fundamental to a democratic society and are enshrined in the 1991 Sierra Leone Constitution (Section 25 and Section 27). They are crucial to maintaining a democratic society where citizens can hold their government accountable and advocate for change., Dr. Konteh added.

Dr. Konteh further highlighted that, the Counter-Terrorism Bill 2024 includes provisions that could potentially criminalize peaceful protests or acts aimed at compelling government action, which are often part of our democratic engagement. "While the goal of combating

terrorism is essential, we must be careful not to create laws that restrict our ability to express ourselves or engage in peaceful activism."

Dr. Konteh' Key Concerns are:

#### 1. Criminalization of Dissent -

The law grants the government sweeping powers to designate individuals or organizations as "terrorists" based on the mere suspicion of opposition to government policies. This dangerously broad language could lead to the silencing of critics, journalists, and activists who raise legitimate concerns about governance, human rights, and corruption.

- 2. Violation of Constitutional
  Rights Sections of the
  proposed Bill directly
  contradict Sierra Leone's
  1991 Constitution, which
  guarantees the fundamental
  rights of all citizens. In
  particular, it undermines the
  protections of freedom of
  speech and expression,
  essential to any thriving
  democracy.
- 3. Unaccountable Powers to
  Government Officials This
  Bill proposes giving
  significant powers to
  government ministers and
  unelected officials, including
  imposing sanctions and
  confiscating assets under the
  guise of counterterrorism.

This creates the potential for politically motivated actions that threaten the freedoms of Sierra Leoneans.

- 4. Lack of Public Consultation —
  The speed at which this Bill is being pushed through
  Parliament, without proper debate or public consultation, is deeply concerning. Such an important piece of legislation deserves to be thoroughly debated with all stakeholders, including the media, civil society, and the people it seeks to govern.
- 5. Chilling Effect on Media and Journalism This Bill would provide a legal basis for silencing any media outlet that dares to hold power to account, undermining the free press essential to democracy.

"I stand firmly for a democratic Sierra Leone, where citizens can freely express their views, challenge authority, and demand accountability. I strongly oppose any attempt to use the guise of counterterrorism to silence political opposition, civil society, and the media," Dr. Konteh stressed.

On his response to Dr. Konteh's

On his response to Dr. Konteh's open letter titled "RE: Urgent Call to Reject the Counter-Terrorism Bill 2024 in the Current Context," Hon. Abdul Kargbo expressed appreciation for Dr. Konteh's active engagement and the detailed concerns he has raised regarding the Counter-Terrorism Bill 2024.

Dr. Konteh expressed his gratefulness to Hon. Abdul Kargbo for his response, which demonstrates a commitment to transparency and public engagement. Readers can find the detailed analysis of the specific clauses within the Bill that Dr. Konteh believe could lead to unintended violations of fundamental rights, including issues around freedom of expression, due process, and the right to privacy on his website https://www.dunifier.com/post/a ddressing-concerns-about-thesierra-leone-counter-terrorismbill-2024.

"As we move forward, it is critical that we engage in a thoughtful and transparent review of the Bill to ensure that national security measures do not come at the expense of the very freedoms that define our democratic society. The right to protest, organize, and express dissent must be protected, and I hope that my concerns, along with those of many other Sierra Leoneans, will be carefully considered as we work toward legislation that safeguards both our national security and our rights," Dr. Konteh encourages Parliamentary members.

We must protect our freedoms and safeguard the future of Sierra Leone by ensuring that the laws passed in our Parliament serve to protect the interests of the people, not to serve the interests of the few in power.

Let us remember that a democracy is only as strong as the freedom of its people to speak truth to power. It is time for accountability, transparency, and the protection of our civil rights.

# GLOOMY DAYS FOR SIERRA LEONE

#### Drugs and Diplomatic Shenanigans



Sierra Leone is facing a confluence of crises, raising serious concerns about its ability to combat drug trafficking and maintain its international reputation. Recent allegations of harbouring a notorious European drug kingpin, coupled with a separate cocaine smuggling incident involving Sierra Leone's embassy officials in Guinea and the ongoing "kush" epidemic, paint a troubling picture.

Jos Leijdekkers, also known as "Bolle Jos," one of Europe's most-wanted fugitives, has reportedly been residing in Sierra Leone, posing in photos with top government officials. Convicted in absentia in the Netherlands for smuggling over seven tonnes of cocaine, Leijdekkers' presence in Sierra Leone has sparked international outrage. Dutch authorities are prioritizing his extradition, while Sierra Leonean officials remain largely silent.

Reuters news agency reported Leijdekkers' presence was potentially captured in a social media video posted by the President's wife. The situation has ignited calls for transparency and accountability, with figures like Dr. Richard Konteh demanding a full investigation into how such a high-profile fugitive could find refuge in the country. The substantial \$210,000 reward offered for information leading to his arrest underscores the gravity of the situation.

Adding to the growing concerns, a separate incident involving suspected cocaine found in a Sierra Leone embassy vehicle in Guinea has further damaged the nation's image. Seven suitcases containing the substance were discovered by Guinean officials, leading Sierra Leone to recall its ambassador to Guinea for questioning. While the government still remain tightlipped in the incident, it raises serious questions about the potential misuse of diplomatic channels for illicit activities.

These events unfold against the backdrop of Sierra Leone's devastating "Kush" crisis. This highly addictive and destructive psychoactive drug, often containing human bones, has ravaged communities, particularly among young men. The government's response has been inadequate. The strain on mental health services is immense, with a dramatic surge in "kush"-related admissions at the country's only psychiatric hospital. Communities have resorted to vigilante justice in some cases, highlighting the desperation caused by the drug's widespread availability.


Further complicating matters, a United Nations Security Council document has surfaced regarding the appointment of President Bio's daughter, Agnes Bio, as an alternate representative to the UN Security Council. Concerns have been raised about the potential for this position to provide diplomatic cover for criminal activities, particularly in light of Leijdekkers' presence in the country. Links between Agnes Bio and Leijdekkers, reported by Reuters, have fueled these anxieties, prompting calls for investigations from Dr. Richard Konteh on his X profile and raising fears of a burgeoning drug cartel operating under the guise of diplomatic immunity. The timing of this appointment, coupled with the recent drugrelated incidents, has amplified concerns about potential corruption and the erosion of Sierra Leone's integrity on the international stage.



The combined effect of these incidents has placed Sierra Leone under intense scrutiny. The international community is watching closely to see how the government addresses these serious allegations and demonstrates its commitment to combating drug trafficking and upholding the rule of law. Failure to act decisively could have severe consequences for Sierra Leone's reputation, its stability, and the well-being of its citizens.

I love this quote from Coach John Wooden, "I welcome good luck just as anyone does, but I worked extremely hard to avoid being in a situation in which luck was necessary to produce a favorable outcome or where the luck of an adversary could defeat us."

If your dream is unrealistic, you will depend on things that are outside of your control to make it a reality. There must be a balance between the boldness of your dream and the reality of your situation.

Successful people, like Coach Wooden, have mastered the art of reaching beyond what they're capable of while depending on factors within their control. This is called aligning your dreams with your talent.

John Maxwell says, "When people's talent does not match their dreams and they fail to recognize it, they will be forever working but never winning."

I want to challenge you to look in the mirror and be honest with yourself about your dreams. Are you trying to do things that you really aren't suited for? Reality is never the enemy of a dream as long as you are depending on factors within your control. Factors like your ability, your habits, and your potential.

Ask yourself these questions as you seek to find that place where dream and reality meet:

- 1. What is my dream?
- 2. What are my strengths?
- 3. What are my weaknesses?
- 4. What are my positive habits?
- 5. What are my negative habits?
- 6. How long must I practice my positive habits to reach my potential?

Believing in your dream isn't enough. You must understand your reality if you want to see your dream come true. I want to encourage you today—dream big, dream bold, and dream beyond imagination!

But more than that, I want to see you accomplish your dreams. And I believe that is possible—with a lot of work. So what are you waiting for?

- 3. The Dane drinks tea.
- 4. The house with green walls is just to the left of the house with white walls.
- 5. The owner of the house with green walls drinks coffee.
- 6. The man who smokes Pall Mall keeps birds.
- 7. The owner of the house with yellow walls smokes Dunhills.
- 8. The man in the center house drinks milk.
- 9. The Norwegian lives in the first house.
- 10. The Blend smoker has a neighbor who keeps cats.
- 11. The man who smokes Blue Masters drinks beer.
- 12. The man who keeps horses lives next to the Dunhill smoker.
- 13. The German smokes Prince.
- 14. The Norwegian lives next to the house with blue walls.
- 15. The Blend smoker has a neighbor who drinks water.

The popular lore of the riddle traces it back to Einstein's teaching days. According to the story, the scientist gave the riddle to students to discourage them from picking him as their academic advisor, though this is likely just a legend. Another dubious element has been added to the riddle's story since it hit the internet: Allegedly only 2 percent of the world's population can solve it.
